FY 2022 Services

- Laurel House, Inc. provided services to 870 individuals. There was no interruption in client service due to COVID - 19 restrictions.
- As essential workers, Laurel House employees have continued to work at the Resource Center, in the community, in-person and with virtual services.
- www.rtor.org had 1,131,068 unique visitors and 1,666 requests for personalized service were responded to by two rtor.org Resource Specialists.
- Laurel House, Inc. and www.rtor.org are committed to the advancement of racial equity and social justice, and to making mental health services accessible to all.



FY 2022 Outcomes

Supported Education

- 110 participants: 24% in Associates; 33% in Bachelors; 20% in Vocational Certification; 5% in GED; 4% in Masters; 5% in high school; and 9% applying to programs
- Onsite at college campuses and high schools

Supported Employment

- 112 participants with 62% competitively employed and 58% employed over 12 months

Mobile Employment Services (MES)

- 35 individuals with substance use disorders received onsite Service at Recovery Houses

Social Rehabilitation/Skill Building

- 739 individuals received services in: Writers, Artists, and Skill Building Workshops; Recovery planning, outreach, advocacy, peer support and wellness programs, including delivery of food to participants

Thinking Well (Cognitive Remediation)

- 73 participants: 95% who completed sessions and took post-assessment achieved improvement in at least 1 of 5 domains; 70% improved in 3 domains; 50% improved in 4 of 5 and 5% improved in all domains
- Greatest areas improvement: Working memory; problem solving

Community Support Services and Housing

- 76 participants received support services and housing: Case management and counseling in recovery planning, Activities of Daily Living (ADLs), and budgeting
